DESCRIPTIVE GUIDE for the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County

The Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County is responsible for preserving and maintaining all court files and papers. making and keeping a complete record of all proceedings and determinations of all Court cases, collecting court fines and fees and performing other duties as required by law.

The Court Operations and Administration section of the Office of Clerk of the Circuit Court of Cook County is organized into five bureaus and the Civil Appeals Division.

Four bureaus are organized by types of cases heard. The fifth bureau is Records Management, which provides file management services to the four other bureaus.

FIRST MUNICIPAL/PROBATE/ COUNTY BUREAU The First Municipal/County Bureau consists of the Civil Division, Traffic Division, Probate Division and County Division.

Civil Division

The Civil Division is responsible for handling civil cases seeking damages less than \$30,000. The types of cases heard include: contract, property damage, personal injury, eviction, replevin, attachments and garnishments. Dalev Center, Room 601. (312) 603-5116.

Civil Division Housing

The majority of cases filed in Housing Court are brought for zoning, health and fire violations of the Building Code. Housing Court Liaison, Daley Center, Room 602 (312) 603-5145.

Civil Division Pro Se

Pro se petitioners can file for up to \$3,000 in small claims. The party must act as his/her own attorney. Assistance is provided through the Chief Judge's Office. Daley Center, Room 602 (312) 603-5626 or 603-2715.

• Traffic Division

The Traffic Division is responsible for maintaining the records and collecting fines for all cases involving City of Chicago traffic matters except parking. Daley Center. Lower Level (LL), Room 19 (312) 603-2000.

Probate Division

The Probate Division handles wills/estates of the deceased, quardianships, estates of the disabled, minors and wards of the state and applications for passports. Daley Center, Room 1202 (312) 603-6441.

County Division

The County Division hears actions and proceedings concerning mental health issues, adoption, the emancipation of minors, changes of name, various issues related to taxes. tax deeds, elections, unclaimed property and certificates of mistake. Dalev Center. Room 1202 (312) 603-5516.

CRIMINAL/JUVENILE BUREAU

The Criminal/Juvenile Bureau consists of the Criminal Department, Criminal Division, Domestic Violence Division. Child Protection Division and Juvenile Justice Division.

Criminal Department

The Criminal Department is responsible for the administration and maintenance of records of felony preliminary hearings, misdemeanor criminal and quasi-criminal cases that occur in the City of Chicago. Daley Center, Room 1006 (312) 603-4641.

Criminal Division

The Criminal Division has jurisdiction over felony offenses within Cook County. It conducts hearings concerning habeas corpus and extradition in criminal matters, petitions to expunge records of arrest, all post-conviction matters and the processing of appeals. Central Bond Court is in session seven days a week and on court holidays (773) 674-5882, 2650 S. California Ave., Chicago, IL (773) 674-3140.

Domestic Violence Division

The Domestic Violence Division hears Civil and Criminal Orders of Protection and domestic violence cases that occur within the City of Chicago. 555 W. Harrison, Chicago, IL (312) 325-9500.

Child Protection Division

The Child Protection Division has original jurisdiction over all children under the age of 18 requiring authoritative intervention, including addicted minors, dependent, neglected or abused children. 2245 W. Oaden Ave., Room 13, Chicago, IL (312) 433-6868.

Juvenile Justice Division

The Juvenile Justice Division has exclusive jurisdiction over all minors under the age of 17 who have violated a federal or state law or municipal ordinance other than traffic, boating, fish and game law violations. 1100 S. Hamilton St., Room 13, Chicago, IL (312) 433-4941.

FAMILY/CHANCERY/LAW BUREAU

The Family/Chancery/Law Bureau consists of the Child Support Division, Domestic Relations Division, Chancery Division and Law Division.

Child Support Division

The Child Support Division actively participates in the child support enforcement IV-D program throughout Cook County, and processes, disburses and keeps permanent records of court ordered child support payments to custodial parents. It also maintains all court files on active parentage and support cases, processes cases for the

Cook County State's Attorney's Office, pro se litigants and private attorneys. Daley Center, Lower Level (LL) Room **19 (312) 345-4144.** In addition, the Child Support Division supports the judiciary in five courtrooms in the Daley Center, Concourse Level (CL 08-12) (312) 603-1236.

Domestic Relations Division

The Domestic Relations Division hears cases involving dissolution, legal separation or invalidity, Civil Orders of Protection and post decree issues. Daley Center, Room 802 (312) 603-6300.

Chancery Division

The Chancery Division hears matters of equity which are filed under the following categories: class actions. Declaratory Judgments, mortgage foreclosures. Injunctions, most Administrative Reviews, General Chancery and Mechanic Liens. Daley Center, Room 802 (312) 603-5133.

Law Division

The Law Division hears actions in which the amount of the claim is in excess of \$30,000 for the City of Chicago and \$100,000 for the suburban districts. Cases heard include: personal injury, property damage, breach of contract and appointment of trustees. Daley Center, Room 801 (312) 603-5426.

SUBURBAN BUREAU

The Suburban Bureau consists of the five Municipal District courthouses located in Skokie, Rolling Meadows, Maywood, Bridgeview and Markham. Cases heard in the suburban districts are similar to those heard in the First Municipal District (City of Chicago), but originate in the suburban municipalities within each district.
